



Getting Your Kid Started in Soccer

So you've got a son/daughter who wants to play soccer?

The Whitefish Bay Soccer Club, an affiliate of the Milwaukee Kickers Soccer Club, has over 1000 kids ranging in age from K5 through high school. Started in 1981, the WFBSC has over 800 kids play in Club (Rec) leagues along with almost 300 (in older age groups) participate in the more competitive local and State Select leagues.

Your child will join a Club team, which generally involves a game once each weekend during the season as well as a practice on a weekday. (If they're old enough, they can give a Select team a shot during June tryouts. There is information on the WFBSC Select on our website:

Here's how:

1. Register your family/child on the MKSC website.

Click "Registration" on the top menu.

- 1) The registration fee covers a year of play. A 'year' spans September of one calendar year through the following summer, and for Club (rec) players, includes a fall and a spring season of games. Registration for a September->August season runs during the May before that September. For example, registration for the September 2010 -> August 2011 season opens during May 2010
- 2) Milwaukee Kickers registration fee - ranging from \$75 to \$130, depending on age varies by age group.
- 3) Kicker WFB region fee - \$40 per player, Whitefish Bay \$80 max per family-if you have more than 2 players in the program, the difference will be refunded post registration.
- 4) Mandatory volunteer buyout fee - \$50 per player. This is refunded after 5 hours of volunteer work per player.
- 5) Late fee - \$30 after June 10th. Note: There is no late fee for U6 or Select/Select tryouts players signing up for Club (Rec) Soccer.

What if you want to join but it's not May anymore? You can still register, subject to availability of a spot on a team. Generally, there are openings for the younger age groups throughout the year.

Registration fees go both toward MKSC and WFBSC items, such as individual uniform, team ball, team medical bag, individual WYSA registration, secondary medical insurance, continuing education for coaches, and so on.

When you register, you'll select the age group for your child. At the bottom of the Membership Registration page on the MKSC site, there's a description of how age groups match up with birthdays. For example, as of May, 2009, U7 players are those born 8/1/01 -> 7/31/02.

2. (optional) Contact the WFBSC age group coordinator.

Registrations from the MKSC website are automatically collected by the WFBSC registrar and teams are formed for each age group.

The registrar will assign your child to a team, either one being formed or one in existence, depending on age group and when during the year you're joining.

3. The coach of your team will contact you with:

- schedule for games and practices for the upcoming season
- uniform
- roster

4. You will need to get:

- shin guards
- soccer specific shoes (Baseball or other cleats are not allowed)
- ball (U6-8 uses a Size 3, U9-12 uses a Size 4, U13+ uses a Size 5)
- water bottle

Note that team uniform shirt, shorts and socks are included in the Club (rec) registration fee.

You may also want to pick up (this is all optional)

- gym bag
- sweats
- girls - place for earrings, jewelry (can't wear jewelry at games)
- special sports eyeglasses

6. Other Opportunities

WFBSC offers other opportunities as well, including our own WFBSC Indoor Tournament (usually late January), skill oriented events such as clinics and futsal, and social events like the annual Sprecher Night and gatherings at Wave games. You'll hear about these through your coach and others through the regular WFBSC emails.
